New Hampshire NOW - A statewide photography Project

The non-profit New Hampshire Society of Photographic Artists (NHSPA) has launched an 18 month photography project to document the people, culture, architecture, industry, landscapes, and events of the Granite State. Photographers will travel across the state making photographs in the spirit of Farm Security Administration photographers like Dorothea Lang, Walker Evans and Carl Mydans who documented all aspects of life during the depression.

“Local participation and knowledge of the community is extremely important for a committed and strong public representation in the project,” said project leader and New Hampshire Artist Laureate Gary Samson.

Samson and a volunteer committee are overseeing the project, meeting with photographers to assure the creation of high quality photographs and final exhibits.

Upon completion, the photographs will be exhibited at regional and statewide locations and a book of the photos is planned. The work will ultimately reside in historic archives as a document of life in the state during the 18-month period.
